C-1: Research, Note Taking & Writing in Third or Fourth Grade Classrooms – Jaime Bailey

Note taking – UGH! Are you tired of third or fourth graders just copying the entire text to write summaries? Are you looking for simple and practical strategies that support the most struggling students and allow your advanced students to soar? Videos, info graphics, tables, charts, and articles are just a few of the non-fiction sources students need to know how to make meaning from and then summarize. Learn how to help third or fourth graders take better notes, organize their ideas, and write more cohesive responses.

C-2: Using Videos and Messages that Motivate Students Writing – Ryan Doetch

Transform your third or fourth graders' writing using Social Emotional Learning (SEL) and growth mindset videos which focus on learning, increased effort, and a willingness to learn from mistakes. Walk away with writing ideas that foster and support social connections among all students and promote the social, emotional, and cognitive skills students need to successfully negotiate peer interactions, develop positive peer relationships, and thrive in school.

Knowledge of prefixes/suffixes and when to add them to roots/bases is the centerpiece of this practical workshop that develops decoding, encoding (spelling), and vocabulary skills. Activities for this workshop will support learners at the "within word pattern," "syllable juncture," "affixes," and "derivational relations" stages of phonics development. We'll investigate how best to teach phoneme proficiency, spelling patterns, syllable structures, and morphology (how words are formed using meaningful word parts), thus resulting in increased reading and spelling achievement.

D-1: Students' Self-Monitoring Their Learning – *Jaime Bailey*

Why are we doing all the work? How can we use some simple strategies to engage third or fourth graders in self-monitoring? Self-monitoring can improve behavior, academic, and social and emotional growth. When students self-monitor their progress toward the learning goal it increases the speed and likelihood, they will hit the target! This session is about easy ways for third or fourth graders to self-monitor and even begin to give each other more productive feedback.

D-2: Make Learning Come Alive with a Classroom Escape Room – *Ryan Doetch*

Classroom escape rooms provide an opportunity for your third or fourth graders to play active roles in their learning. Watch engagement soar as students become immersed in the game – asking questions, solving problems, and participating in group discussions. An escape room gamifies learning to create an engaging and empowering experience for students of all grade levels. Students learn best when they are engaged!
