As an occupational therapist who spends most of my days in schools, I worry about how schools handle challenging behavior. I see teachers often removing students from the classroom due to challenging behavior; I see more students on reduced days due to their behavior; I see students spending less time with their peers due to challenging behavior; I see families, teams, and students stressed now more than ever about how to “handle” challenging behavior. - All behavior has a function and purpose. Helping kids identify alternate ways to achieve positive behavior enables kids to change it
